



Research Study About Young Children's Language Production

We invite you and your child to participate in a research study designed to develop a clinical tool for identifying children at high risk for later language disorders.

Your Involvement Will Include

1. Complete a family information form and developmental checklists
2. Two 1-hour sessions when your child is 27-33 months old
3. Two 1-hour sessions when your child is 33-39 months old
4. A hearing screening at the Audiology and Speech-Language Pathology Clinic, if your child has not received a hearing evaluation during the past year

Your child will talk with the researcher about pictures and animations and engage with you during 10 minutes of parent-child play at each session. Total family time commitment is 4-5 hours over 6 months.
